The Brookdale (1700 Avenue Road)

A development of this nature requires that a Construction Management Plan (CMP) be prepared to provide details on how the developer will manage the construction, impacts and safety to the neighbouring community to ensure disruptions are kept to a minimum and safety always maximized. An extract has been prepared of this document (attached).

The developer has committed to try to minimize disruption as much as possible but with a large project of this nature, events are likely going to arise where we will have to exercise patience. However, major and on-going issues should be reported to **311**. Reporting an issue to 311 creates a log. Repeat calls signal a recurring problem to the City.
