SAHRA INFORMATION – Feb 12, 2018

Speed Humps on Elm Rd between Joicey and Felbrigg

Back in November, 2017 we advised SAHRA residents that the Councillor/North York Community Council had directed Transportation Services to poll eligible households (94 households) on Elm Rd between Felbrigg and Joicey to (1) determine whether residents support the installation of traffic calming and (2) to develop a Traffic Calming Hump Plan and investigate the feasibility of reducing the speed limit to 30 km/h. 57 ballots were returned with 43 in favour, 11 opposed and 3 spoiled.

The Transportation Services Report has now been published (attachment with associated documents) and will be heard on February 21, 2018 by the North York Community Council.

Toronto Paramedic Services and the Toronto Fire Dept are opposed to the installation. The Warrant criteria for Traffic Calming is NOT met. But the Polling results are in favour and that provides the direction for the staff recommendations.

The Recommendations to NYCC are:

- 1. Authorize the installation of traffic calming on Elm Road, between Joicey Boulevard and Felbrigg Avenue (2 speed humps are to be installed).
- 2. Authorize the speed limit reduction from **40 km/h** to **30 km/h** on Elm Road, between Joicey Boulevard and Felbrigg Avenue, when the speed humps are installed.

Reminder – Community Meeting about 250 Lawrence Ave West development

It will be a tough battle with a well-financed development firm but the Residents' Associations feel it is essential that we defend Lawrence Avenue and Avenue Road.

SAHRA/OOGRA/LPRO and the Participant resident groups are holding a meeting to talk about this development and the OMB Appeal with the Community.
