SAHRA Survey - Winter 2018

The Directors of SAHRA decided to conduct a Survey of the residents in our area to determine items of interest to our members and to change and/or confirm SAHRA's priorities. As SAHRA does not have enough Board members and volunteers to execute all of our interests, we need to prioritize and resource the items of the greatest interest to our members.

A number of questions were formulated, many multiple choice but also short answer. The survey was available online, through links published in our eBlasts. A print Newsletter, distributed to every residence in SAHRA's neighbourhood, also included a copy which could be completed and submitted, as well as the URL for the online version. Both versions of the survey were identical. The online survey was open from February 28 to April 15. The paper copy was distributed during the first week of March. There were a total of 61 responses - 40 using the online survey and 21 paper submissions.

- Much higher response rate for the North area (right-hand chart)

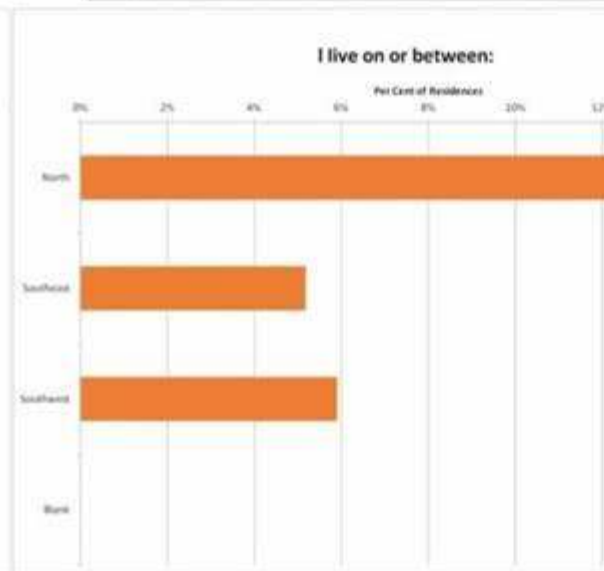
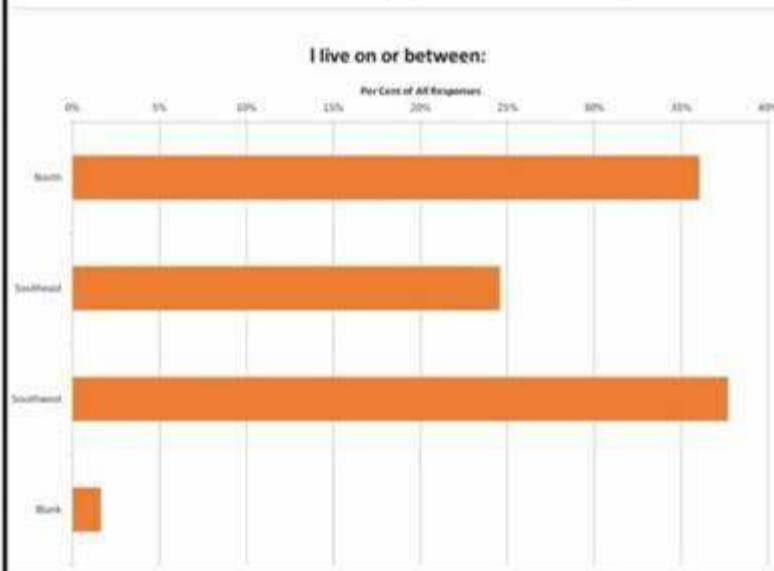
North: Wilson north side and further

Southeast: Esgore east side and further

Southwest: Esgore west side and further

Left chart: percent of responses

Overview of survey results (cont'd)

- There is wide interest in commercial development on Avenue Rd. Top 3:
 1. Height
 2. Traffic
 3. Village feel
- Four fifths of respondents have visited SAHRA's website. Interest is broad but variable by area. Top 3:
 1. Development and construction issues
 2. Traffic / parking / speed limits
 3. Crime prevention
- Issues residents have had to deal with: Variable by area.
 - All areas: Traffic / parking / speed limits
 - Development and associated issues (CofA, OMB, TLAB, construction) are highest in South and still important in Southeast
 - North: Emergency Services, Crime Prevention, Flooding
- Requested priorities for SAHRA. Top 3:
 1. Development and construction issues
 2. Traffic
 3. Crime prevention
 4. Avenue Road Avenue Study came in a close 4

Survey insights for SAHRA's Board

- Higher response rate from the North area
 - Not sure what this means
- General support in current priorities
 - Development and construction issues
 - Traffic
 - Avenue Road Avenue Study
- Issue requiring more attention
 - Crime prevention
