We will confirm the date/time/location in future eBlasts and on our Website.



What SAHRA Does

The mandate of the South Armour Heights Residents' Association is to act as an advocate for the residents of SAHRA, to protect our neighbourhood from inappropriate development, to promote safety and security in the *Neighbourhood* and to enhance the environment and social life in our community.

The SAHRA Board and Volunteers have been very busy in 2019!

Here are several of our activities.

Based on the 2018 Survey, SAHRA increased our focus on **community safety**. We partnered with the Upper Avenue Community Association (UACA) to host a Community Safety Night. We also kicked off our Neighbourhood Watch Online program (more info on Page 3).

We actively reviewed 13 **Committee of Adjustment** (CofA) applications. In one case we negotiated with the owner to replace a concrete driveway with permeable materials. At 113 Ridley, we objected to several variances including one which goes against the by-law which only allows 2-storeys. The owner deferred at the CofA hearing – we expect to see a new application in 2020.

We also dealt with 2 appeals to the **Toronto Local Appeal Body** (TLAB). Unfortunately, the parking variances at the rear of 1560 Avenue Road were approved; at 159 Ridley, SAHRA's concerns were addressed by changes to the plans.

In 2019, the OMB approved an application for **250 Lawrence Ave West**. SAHRA and others had fought this application - we were at least able to have its approved height reduced. SAHRA was involved with the Site Plan Working Group to help mitigate impacts from the development on the community. The developer will now be responsible for completing Glengarry Park and has stated that they will not request closing of traffic lanes on Lawrence during construction. We are still working to ensure that the Douglas Greenbelt ravine will be cleaned up. We are also very concerned with the possibility that traffic exiting the condo will be allowed to turn left onto Lawrence in this high-traffic and student-intense area, close to Avenue Road and Rosewell Avenue.


SAHRA worked with the City, the Bedford Park Residents Organization and the owner of the property at the **northeast corner of Avenue Road and Lawrence** (1507 Avenue Road) to design landscaping which ensures that unsafe access to the parking lot from city streets is not allowed.

Over the last several years, there have been several near misses at the corner of **Joicey and Harley**. SAHRA worked with the neighbours, Councillor Colle and Traffic Services resulting in improved safety by the installation of an allway stop.

We have continued to review **pedestrian safety, traffic congestion and parking issues** close to Armour Heights Public School and the Toronto Cricket Skating and Curling Club. We are also pleased that Councillor Colle has initiated a traffic study on Avenue Road between Brooke and Hwy 401.

In the Fall, SAHRA started a **drive to obtain contact information** from our residents. As a result, we have 132 additional email addresses. We will continue in the Spring. Thanks to all our volunteers.

We hosted the 14th annual **Neighbours' Night Out** last June in a new location – at the corner of Belgrave and Armour. This is our annual opportunity for new and old neighbours to meet. We served ice cream, handed out balloons, and the Fire Department and the Police visited to the delight of the kids.

Community Safety, Crime Prevention and Neighbourhood Watch Online

In late 2018, a SAHRA Board member and a Volunteer joined the Community Police Liaison Committee at 32 Division. This committee meets on a monthly basis and provides a communication channel between the police and several community groups, including SAHRA. Several of our eBlasts have included safety and crime information from this committee and from other sources.

On May 1, 2019, SAHRA partnered with the Upper Avenue Community Association (UACA) to host a Community Safety Event at Lawrence Park Collegiate. Trending of crime data was presented at the 32 Division level and also at SAHRA's subarea level. (There are three sub-areas within SAHRA's neighbourhood). Information from the evening can be found on the Information/Crime Prevention page of our website – search for "Community Safety Night".

One of the most effective ways of reducing crime is to know your neighbours and watch out for each other. Criminals are much less likely to strike if they know that there is a network of neighbours who recognize each other and question when something appears to be amiss. To this end, SAHRA and UACA jointly launched a "new, improved" Neighbourhood Watch concept at the Community Safety Event. We are supporting Group Captains to form small groups of residents who communicate with each other primarily through online means, such as email.

We already have several Neighbourhood Watch Online Groups up and running but if you are not covered by one of these groups, then we are looking for a volunteer Group Captain in your area. We estimate the time commitment as a few hours to set up the group and then minimally after that to co-ordinate a few communications per month. We provide training and documentation. Interested in being a Group Captain? Please contact us at info@sahratoronto.com and help us make Neighbourhood Watch Online a reality throughout SAHRA's neighbourhood.
